Halachic Corner

Hilchos Pesukei D'zimrah

One should not write anything during Pesukei D'zimrah unless it is for a Mitzvah purpose or to prevent someone from doing something which is prohibited, or if one is pressed to respond to someone even for a non-Mitzvah purpose. (Preferably one should do so only between chapters, or at least Pesukim) Piskei Tshuvos 51:8, see fn78, Tshuvus V'Hanhagos 2:40, MB 51:12,13

If one interrupted in middle of Pesukei D'zimrah by speaking, one should go back to the beginning of the Posuk that one interrupted. Piskei Tshuvos 51:8 fn80, Shulchan Aruch Harav 66:2
